
Highlights

Population Growth: The total population in the Plumas County Library jurisdiction decreased by 5% over the past decade to 23,000, in contrast to 10% statewide growth. The sharpest decline occurred among young people (-22%).

Diversity: This jurisdiction is predominantly white, non-Hispanic, though this share of the population declined over the past decade from 89% to 86%, while the Hispanic share increased from 6% to 8% of total.



Population by Age

Age Structure: The population here is older than in the state

overall, with people age 65+ making up 21% of the jurisdiction's population compared to 11% in California as a whole. Young people make up 21% of the population, which is down from 25% in 2000 and low compared to the 28% share statewide.

Households: Husband-wife families with children are uncommon here–just 13% of all households, compared with 23% statewide–and this share is down from 20% of households in 2000. The share of households made up of people living alone grew from 28% to 30% of total, compared with 23% of households statewide. People age 65+ in the Plumas County Library jurisdiction are more likely to be living with a spouse (30%) than are older people statewide (21%).

Education: The Plumas County Library jurisdiction has higher high school attainment but lower college attainment than the state overall. Ten percent of adults have not completed high school, compared with 20% statewide, and 21% have earned a Bachelor's degree or higher, compared with 30% in California.

Note: The Plumas County Library jurisdiction includes Plumas County and Sierra County. This profile covers only Plumas County and is provided for reference.


